## The Political Theology of White Guilt

The presidential post-election period now unfolding in the US is having a big impact on the political class in Europe. Historically speaking this is nothing new. Every politician in Europe knows that any major political change in the US is bound to have an immediate effect on his own policy making and may determine the length of his career. This mode of pro-American mimicry among European politicians has been playing out in full force since 1945.

Thus, it should not come as a surprise that the mainstream media in Europe and high-ranking *European Union* (EU) officials are following U.S. media outlets in a unified effort to destroy Donald Trump and taint his legacy. The German political class, with Chancellor Merkel at the top of the EU System, is at the forefront of this anti-Trump, pro-Biden mimicry. A few timid exceptions are found in Poland, Hungary and Slovenia.

One interesting development is that there is a rising divide between the rulers and the ruled in both Europe and America, with a likelihood of the two becoming pitted against each other and civil unrest a likely result. Increasingly, average citizens -- not just Europe's and America's nationalists -- are becoming increasingly suspicious of "lockdowns" and other restrictions, and no longer accept the absurd and bizarre decrees of their political classes at face value. Many people in Europe like Trump's rhetoric, perhaps more by default, and less by their knowledge of how the American electoral system works.

It must be pointed out that Trump was and still is the American exception to the rule of the post-WWII liberal globalist system. Predictably, Trump's efforts to expose the "fake media" and its ideological allies in the "deep state" does not fit the post-WWII liberal,

communist, antifascist and postcolonial narrative which all White Europeans and Americans have been subjected to since 1945.

In contrast to America, however, European nations have a slim margin for political maneuvering, largely due to their former colonial, authoritarian, totalitarian and anti-liberal past. Consequently, European conservative and nationalist-minded politicians can only navigate around the past and escape denunciations of "fascism" through groveling and self-effacing sermons focusing on "White Man's Guilt." Their penitence has translated into a massive import of non-European migrants, with Europe rapidly becoming a giant Third World Youth Hostel, with repentant Whites as landlords.

This masochistic White mindset can be directly traced to the post-WWII "Auschwitz Political Theology" designated not just as a deterrent for the defeated Germany, but also as a warning to former U.. and U.K. victors. At this stage, any tentative endorsement of Trump-like anti-immigration policies by any EU politician means they run the risk of being accused of fascist or revisionist sympathies. It is a kiss of death to their careers.

As always, in order to grasp the fawning conduct of European leaders toward the "deep state" embedded in America's East Coast, one must put things into a larger historical perspective. With his critical remarks about the "fake media" and his anti-immigration rhetoric, Trump seriously damaged the deep state's narrative and raised some disturbing questions about the legitimacy of the World Order established in the aftermath of WWII.

The parallel "deep state" in Europe is primarily manifested in Germany. Being the heartland of Europe, Germany after 1945 was preordained to serve as a role model for all future EU member states. Today the German government is the primary source of anti-Trump and pro-Biden rhetoric. Given the neurotic nature of Germany's post-WWII nation-state building efforts, such penitent behavior is comprehensible.

Germany was designed to be Europe's shining example of social engineering and racial multiculturalism. This has spawned hundreds of thousands of self-censored and servile politicians and academics, all of whom live in deadly fear of what has been called the "cancel culture" in America. In discussing public issues, German politicians and academics must be on high alert and endeavor to be "more Catholic than the Pope" by attacking Trump and praising Biden. The same principle applies to all non-German European politicians, albeit to a lesser extent.

The toxic words fascism and racism serve today as powerful tools of self-censorship in Germany, which explains why Germany has been the most fervent advocate of its own self-destructive multiculturalist enthusiasms over recent decades and the last decade in particular. Self-censorship has manifested in the relentless importation of non-white Third World immigrants.

Germany's self-censorship will be supplemented by the heavy-handed and self-righteous edicts of its public officials. In a shining example of the left's willingness to employ extreme rhetoric and its authoritarian impulses, Heiko Maas, the German minister of foreign affairs recently issued the following statement: "I will proceed against the extreme right-wing venom for our democracy." This was to counter any speculation that Germany might eventually depart from its current path toward a socialist and globalist New World Order scheme.

Such a show of German and European atonement is a natural and logical result of the indoctrination that has been going on in the media and higher education in the East and West since 1945. Hence, if Trump persists in accusing the mainstream media and the deep state of political dishonesty in its coverage of a stolen election, that inevitably raises the question as to how fake the entire system and its historical narrative have been over the last seventy years. Trump was and is a threat to the entire post-WWII narrative of the West.

The heroic Russian anticommunist dissident and writer Alexander Solzhenitsyn wrote long ago that we "should not live the Communist Lie." Well, time seems to be ripe to raise the same question about the lies of the Liberal System.
