## **REAL** Criminal Justice Reform

When I read anecdotes from "The Armed Citizen" columns that appear in every N.R.A. publication, I am often disappointed when a homeowner merely holds a burglar or home-invader at gunpoint until police arrive: I find myself wishing the homeowner had ventilated the bastard and done the world a favor.

Ironically, Sheriff Bob Johnson of Santa Rosa County, Florida actually recommends that homeowners do as I fantasize. He has stated publicly that his department prefers that homeowners shoot burglars and homeinvaders, because it will save taxpayers the expense of a trial.

Here are his exact words: "If somebody's breaking into your house, you're more than welcome to shoot them in Santa Rosa County, and we prefer that you do, actually...you'll save the taxpayers money."

Sheriff Johnson was referencing Florida's **Stand Your Ground Law**, legislation that has been adopted by a number of others states. Under **Stand Your Ground**, homeowners are no longer required to continuously retreat from a home-invader -- **IN THEIR OWN HOMES!** -- before they are justified in using deadly force.

As Johnson describes it: "A person who is in a dwelling or residence, in which the person has a right to be, has no duty to retreat and has the right to stand his or her ground and use or threaten to use deadly force."
