

Successful "PIT" Maneuver

At one a.m. on April 20th, four black teens were killed near Waldo, Florida, following a police chase that reached speeds of 111 M.P.H. After the four stole an SUV mere hours before, the **Florida Highway Patrol** executed a "PIT" maneuver to stop their vehicle, causing it to spin out of control, roll over and crash against a cement pole. Gone are four deceased, black scofflaws between the ages of 14 and 16.

The stolen SUV was detected by a license plate reader, initiating a vehicle pursuit by **Bradford County Sheriff's Deputies** and ultimately, the **Florida Highway Patrol** after Bradford County's vehicles could not reach sufficient speed to overtake the stolen SUV. Two teens died at the scene, and two died later despite receiving costly medical care they didn't deserve in an effort to save their already misspent lives.

Despite the tender ages of the four, police reported that two of the deceased teens were wearing **ankle monitors** from earlier scrapes with the law, and three of the four had active **warrants** issued against them. Some of the vehicle's occupants were also wearing **ski masks** to obscure their identities while engaged in their new avocation, grand theft auto.

The serendipitous death of all four occupants saved the State of Florida millions by foregoing the anticipated costs of trying and incarcerating these ***Future Lifers of America***. Even as teens, they were experienced criminals: to borrow a line from *Dirty Harry Callahan*, "**they weren't out collecting for the Red Cross.**"
