
## **Noonan's Insight**

The other day I was flipping through a favorite book, *What I Saw at the Revolution* by Peggy Noonan. Noonan was a celebrated speechwriter for *The Gipper*, to whom Reagan's former *Chief of Staff* and *Treasury Secretary*, Don Regan, referred as "*The girl who writes the poetry*." She later joined the Editorial Board at the *WALL STREET JOURNAL*, where she's become more of a *poacher* than the *gamekeeper* she used to be.



In Chapter 15, she describes the first *Reagan-Gorbachev Summit* in November of 1985. The Soviets had been briefed on each member of the U.S. delegation, and tried clumsily to flatter and patronize them. Noonan was approached by a Russian who immediately declared what a pity it was that America was accelerating the arms race by developing a *Strategic Defense Initiative*. When Noonan pointed out that the Soviets were pursuing the same thing -- and *he* headed that program -- he sheepishly moved on to others in the delegation. This freed her to look around the room, where she observed the following:

"...the room was full of similar knots of people, Americans leaning forward and jabbing the air, and Soviets leaning (backwards,) looking surprised. This wasn't what they got when they met with Carter's people. This wasn't what they got when they met with Ford. They were surprised by conviction. It has been a long time since they have seen Americans like this..."

Perhaps the reaction of Soviet communists that Noonan described may help explain the insane and irrational reaction of "Democrats" and other domestic communists to the Trump Administration's political agenda.
