

# "Frail" Women

In Shakespeare's immortal tragedy, *Hamlet*, the protagonist is visited by the ghost of his murdered father who tells him that "*the serpent that did sting thy father now wears his crown.*" Equally unsettling, *Hamlet's* mother naively marries that very *serpent* so soon after her husband's death that "*the funeral's baked meats did coldly furnish forth the wedding tables.*" This prompted *Hamlet* to utter another immortal line of Shakespeare's in reference to his mother: "*Frailty, thy name is woman.*"

The stereotype of unusually frail women probably has its origins in Hollywood films. Many classic films have consistently portrayed women as frail and timid, who repeatedly try to hold back their menfolk from doing "*what a man's gotta do.*" Perhaps the most famous cinematic example of a frail woman attempting to discourage her man from following the demands of his moral code appeared in the film *High Noon*.
